2. Continuing work of reorganizing after June Faire. The goal is to create enough room to get all of the Gold Key items back into the Storage Unit by Last Chance.

3. The Eric-dags created for June Faire 2015 have not yet been located. As you go through your camping boxes and stored event items, please keep an eye out for any that might have been packed in with your supplies. If you have any Baronial assets in your possession, please let me know so we at least know of their location for future Event Teams.

4. Last Chance Tournament is on the horizon. If you are part of the Event Team, please be thinking of what items you may need / want from Storage and then contacting the Autocrat Team and the Steward Team so that we can make arrangements to get whatever you need to you.

5. As always, before adding 'stuff' to the Baronial Inventory, please speak to the Steward so we can judge how much room new material will take up and how much

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room is actually available to hold it in the Unit.

Golden Dragon Pursuivant: It's been a quiet month for heraldry. Heraldic consultation with Countess Elisabeth is available at most fight practices.

Scribe: This has been a quiet month for the Baronial scribal people. Lady Katherine is away starting her medical training. We have several new people interested in scribal activities.

We have started playing with pigments with an eye to making usable paints, having held two Scriptoriums in the last few weeks.

I also gave a brief class on the Scribal Arts as part of the Barony's Summer classes. We are working to produce the charters needed for Last Chance.

Lady Ela and I are planning to hold several Scribal classes at the Tuesday Socials over the next several months, including Beginning Painting, Whitework and Calligraphy. The class dates will be announced shortly.

Baronial Marshal:

Events

Dragon's Lair Warriors struck fear into the hearts of their enemies on the fields of Honey War. The War Leaders of both sides expressed their thanks for our participation.

Heavy Armored

Practice attendance has been fluctuating quite a lot. Some weeks we have a crowd, others it's just two or three. But in all cases, good information is being exchanged and skills are being honed. In July, we made one of our practices a "War Practice" where we worked on the skills more specialized to group combat. In order to optimize fighting time we start practices at 5:30 pm to allow some extra time to armor up. The building will not be available until the Social begins at 6:00 pm. We hold practice as long as we can manage the weather and light, or 8:00 pm, whichever comes first.

Rapier

Rapier practices continue at the VFW Hall on Tuesday evenings in conjunction with the Baronial Social. Come on out and practice. Loaner gear is available and all levels of experience are welcome.

Archery

Archery practices are on Wednesday evenings at the VFW Hall when the weather and mud gods permit.

Thrown Weapons

Thrown Weapons practices run concurrent with heavy practices on Tuesday nights at the VFW Hall. See the Thrown Weapons officer's report for full details.

Equestrian

Practice opportunities are available with some of our Baronial Neighbors. See me if you would like more information.

Youth Armored

Our YAC program is in stasis pending interest from youth fighters.

Siege

Work continues on a catapult and a second and THIRD ballista with hopes that all will be in action soon. The catapult is probably closest to being next. There were some structural failures during testing that will be easily overcome with a simple redesign.

Replacement targets have been acquired and are now in the rotation to get broken in (freshly cut rounds are notorious for being hard to stick on).

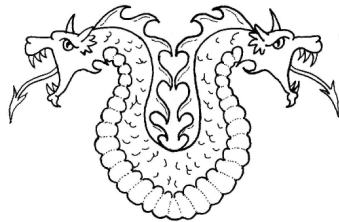

A Practical Guide to Raising Children in the SCA

(Editor's note: This article was originally written in 2009. A heavily edited version was published in the 2010 edition of *The Known World Handbook*. What follows is the original version, updated with my co-author's permission)

The SCA can be a wonderful place to raise children. At a baronial picnic several years ago, my then 9-year-old daughter learned how to milk a goat, watched a clay pot she'd made come intact out of a pit firing, shot a royal round, retrieved arrows from a ballista, and learned how to throw a knife, an axe, and a spear. At larger events, she has learned kumihimo braiding, calligraphy, lampworking, how to curtsy, how to address royalty, and some of the basics of heavy fighting. Most importantly, she has made some delightful friends.

The SCA can also be a challenging place to raise children. Indoor Arts & Sciences events aren't always interesting to youngsters. Period feasts feature foods and seasoning combinations that are frequently unfamiliar even to adult palates. There are age restrictions on our martial activities.

While the SCA is certainly child-friendly, it is decidedly not child-centered. Some branches have youth combat programs; many do not. Many branches have a Family Activities officer; just as many do not.

As with so much in parenting, the way to navigate the SCA with children can be summed up by the following: Do not set yourselves up for failure.

To Bring or Not to Bring?

When you bring your children to SCA events, you are taking responsibility for their experience. By default, your hobby becomes theirs. Like it or not, you are their Chatelaine. If you are not willing guide them, then it would be best for everyone if you left them at home with a responsible and reliable caregiver. I know several parents who leave their kids at "Camp Grandma" while they play at events. Both kids and parents have a lovely time.

Another excellent option is to go ahead and bring your children along, but also bring a trusted babysitter so that everyone can happily and safely pursue their individual interests and commitments, knowing that the children are being properly cherished and cared for by a responsible sitter.

Other parents pick and choose which events to bring their children to, or bring their children to certain portions of each event. For example, my barony's martial

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championship day is always followed by a feast in the evening. After several hours of running around and watching archery, thrown weapons, rapier, equestrian, and heavy fighting, neither of my young children was ever ready to sit quietly and wait for several courses of feast. Thus, my family has never been to that portion of the event.

Okay, I'll bring them. Now what?

Remember that you are your children's Chatelaine. Your goal is to help them feel comfortable, and find a way for you all to fit in. This means that you all must be in garb. It doesn't have to be fancy, truly. Cotton t-tunics in neutral colors and the least modern pair of shoes you all own will be a fine start. The SCA is THE ultimate game of dress up, and it is imperative to include every child in this aspect of the game. Bonus points to the parents that let children participate in choosing their garb. Whether you sew your children's garb yourself, buy it from a merchant, or barter with friends for garb, including your children in the decision making process will make them happy.

Bringing multiple changes of garb for your children is nice. If it is a camping event, children will likely get dirty, spill juice on themselves, etc., and may need to change their garb in the middle of the day. For this same reason, it is also quite sensible to only acquire washable fabric for children's garb. Getting dirty is not a bad thing. If you are concerned about your children getting their garb dirty, then it is probably best to save those particular pristine pieces of garb for a strictly indoor event, such as 12th Night. It is not realistic to bring children camping in full court Elizabethan and then expect them to stay clean. That being said, I have personally seen children camping in full court Elizabethan Garb very successfully - sure they got dirty, but their parents used lovely lightweight washable material, so it wasn't an issue.

Your children will make friends with other children at events. They will want to invite them back to camp to hang out, just like they would at home. They will also want to provide a bit of hospitality. It is wise to set rules with your children about guests beforehand, so that your children can know where the boundaries are. I advise bringing extra water, juice, cups, and snacks specifically for your children to share. Clearing up beforehand what is designated food/beverage for sharing helps to avoid unfortunate incidents. "Gee Mom, I didn't realize it would be a big deal if my gang of friends and I ate all the hoagies you pre-made for lunch when you meticulously packed the cooler," is avoidable!

It is also important to meet the parents of your children's new friends before allowing your children to invite them back to camp. This is important for several reasons: Parental permission needs to be requested and received, allergy inquiries need to be made, plus their location in case of emergency needs to be established. Better to have this information and not need it than vice-versa.

Children under the age of 5 are too small to go to the restroom alone. Period. Bringing a camping toilet is a good idea. There are several articles on how to make a simple, inexpensive camping toilet from things you probably already own, so do not let cost become an obstacle.

Sunscreen! Even if it is overcast. Children don't often spend an entire weekend from sunup until sundown outdoors. Sunburns can make children very ill, and they are avoidable.

Hydration! Bring more water than you think you will need. Often children forget to drink water, and that compounded with the hot sun and extra activity can cause dehydration. Happy campers need water, so it is wise to offer it to your children often. Personally, if my children are playing host to a group of children in our camp, everyone is encouraged to drink water, and lots of it.

Etiquette for children: A person's tent/pavilion/yurt/whatever is exactly like their house. Your child would, of course, NEVER enter anyone's house without permission, right? Reminding your children that tents are like houses, and that the same rules apply is a good idea. If a tent is like a house, then a camp kitchen and lounging area is like a kitchen and living room. Reminding your children to stick to the designated roads instead of perhaps, accidentally, wandering into someone's encampment is a good idea.

Merchants row should be considered a visual activity. Reminding your children to "Look with your eyes only, not your hands," is a good idea. Otherwise, you will wind up paying the merchant for any item your children inadvertently damage or alter in any way. There are of course a few exceptions, and you can discover what those exceptions might be by asking individual merchants their store policies.

Etiquette for parents: Parents or legal guardians are ultimately responsible for their children at events. Parents, legal guardians (or adult caregivers officially designated by them) must supervise their children under the age of 5 at all times. Children between the ages of 5 and 12 may be allowed to explore within visual or audible range of a parent or designated caregiver. Children aged 12 and up may be given more freedom, but if they repeatedly break the rules or misbehave, the entire family may be expelled from the event.

Pack books, toys, and other activities that you know your children will enjoy. I know some kids who have certain toys that only make an appearance at events. Books, playing cards, period games, balls, homemade play dough, watercolor paints, birdseed-filled sensory tables, etc., are a few suggestions for activities of this nature. Please leave the electronics at home or – if your teenager is hopelessly addicted – find a place to enjoy them away from everyone else - like your tent, for example. A good example of where not to use a tablet would be while sitting in Court. Above all, stay with your young children, and keep an eye on the older

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ones as well.

While a growing number of events feature Family Activities, I must emphasize that the Family Activities is not a babysitting service – its intent is to provide activities for parents to enjoy with their children.

A word about safety

As with any group, the SCA has its nice people – and its not-so-nice people. You wouldn't leave your kids alone in your tent at a modern campground while you go to the pub, so you shouldn't leave your kids alone in your tent at an SCA event while you go to a revel. Establishing rules for safety before arriving at an event is a good idea. "Stay within my sight," is a personal favorite, as many problems can be avoided with that one simple rule. The SCA is a microcosm of modern society, encompassing people from all walks of life who happen to share a common interest. There is really no way to tell at a glance what type of person someone is, so reminding your children not to spend time alone with unknown adults is an excellent policy, and reinforces what they have undoubtedly already been taught in the modern world. Keeping your children within eyesight is also an excellent way to make sure that they avoid geographical pitfalls as well. For example, if there is a river on site, an Equestrian arena full of horses, barbed wire, etc., your children will be perfectly safe from these hazards because you will be there supervising, thus ensuring their safety. It's also a great idea to let your children know that heavy and rapier fighters have limited visibility while their helms are on, and for this reason should be avoided unless they are sitting down.

When watching heavy or rapier fighting, please leave some distance between your children and the list ropes. When observing archery or thrown weapons, please stay behind the line and heed the words of the marshal. Keep a respectful distance from horses.

Feasts

Many fall and winter events feature feasts. If you or any of your children have a food allergy it is your responsibility to contact the person in charge of the feast to find out what is on the menu. Many children are picky eaters. If your children fall into this category, find out if there is "off-board" seating available for the feast. "Off-board" means that you'll be seated in the dining hall with everyone else, but you will not be partaking of the served feast. Instead, you will be bringing your own dinner. That way, you can still hang with your friends and enjoy the ambience while allowing your children to eat familiar foods.

We hope that these tips will prove helpful to anyone planning to bring children to an event. The SCA is a wonderful family activity, and bringing our own children along has always been fun, educational, and inspiring.

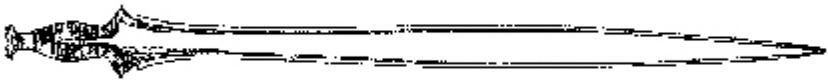
